INTRODUCTION

The purpose of an ADA Transition Plan is to ensure the residents and visitors of Creedmoor have full access to the City's public right-of-way and public facilities. It is designed to accommodate disabled persons of Creedmoor to achieve fair access to facilities without limiting their quality of life. The City of Creedmoor is committed to meet all the accessibility needs of disabled individuals. This ADA Transition Plan includes those plan components specifically requested by the City of Creedmoor to fulfill requirements of the ADA.

TRANSITION PLAN AND PURPOSE

The <u>Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)</u> is a civil rights law prohibiting discrimination against individuals on the basis of disability. It was enacted on July 26,1990, and was amended in 2008 with the ADA Amendments Act. The ADA consists of five titles outlining protections in the following areas:

- I. Employment
- II. State and local government services
- III. Public accommodations
- IV. Telecommunications
- V. Miscellaneous provisions

As required by Title II of ADA (<u>28 CFR Part 35 Sec. 35.105 and Sec. 35.150</u>), Creedmoor has conducted a self-evaluation of its facilities on public property and within public rights-of-way; and has developed this Transition Plan detailing the methods to be used to ensure compliance with ADA accessibility requirements.

AGENCY REQUIREMENTS

Under Title II, Creedmoor must meet these general requirements:

- Must designate at least one responsible employee to coordinate ADA compliance [<u>28 CFR</u> <u>Sec. 35.107(a)</u>]. This person is typically referred to as the ADA Coordinator. The public entity must provide the ADA Coordinator's name, office address, and telephone number to all interested individuals [<u>28 CFR Sec. 35.107(a)</u>].
- Must provide notice of ADA requirements. All public entities, regardless of size, must provide information about the rights and protections of Title II to applicants, participants, beneficiaries, employees, and other interested persons [<u>28 CFR Sec. 35.106</u>]. The notice must include the identification of the employee serving as the ADA Coordinator and must provide this information on an ongoing basis [<u>28 CFR Sec. 104.8(a)</u>].
- Must establish a grievance procedure. Public entities must adopt and publish grievance procedures providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints [<u>28 CFR Sec.</u> <u>35.107(b)</u>]. This requirement provides for a timely resolution of all problems or conflicts related to ADA compliance before they escalate to litigation and/or the federal complaint process.

SELF EVALUATION

Overview

Under Title II of the ADA (<u>28 CFR Sec. 35.105</u>), public entities are required to perform a selfevaluation of their facilities on public property and within public rights-of-way, in order to identify any obstacles or barriers to accessibility that need to be addressed. The general categories of items to be evaluated include: sidewalk mileage calculation, vertical height displacement locations, absence of curb ramps or detectable warnings, demolition and replacement, and facility evaluations. Public entities are required to provide an opportunity for interested persons, including individuals with disabilities or organizations representing individuals with disabilities, to participate in the selfevaluation process by submitting comments [28 CFR Sec. 35.105(b)].

Process & Findings

In December of 2020, Creedmoor completed a self-evaluation of its facilities on public property and within public rights-of-way regarding accessibility. The following right-of-way deficiencies were requested by the City: specific sidewalk areas of approximately 2.3 miles, vertical height displacement locations, absence of curb ramps, absence of detectable warnings, and areas that may require demolition and replacement. These deficiencies were cataloged in a GIS web map and provided to the City. Facilities and Parks were evaluated using the ADA Checklist for Existing Facilities. Detailed inventories and findings from this review are provided in Appendix A.

An important component of the self-evaluation process is the identification of obstacles or barriers to accessibility and the corresponding modifications that will be needed to remedy these items. The following sections provide a summary of improvements that have already been made, and obstacles that Creedmoor plans to address as part of this Transition Plan.

An ADA Self-Evaluation is not an engineering study and therefore items such as curb ramps, detectable warnings, and other architectural modifications were not inspected for exact compliance with ADA standards. If a resident believes any of these existing items do not provide sufficient access to safety, he or she can fill out the grievance form in Appendix B.



PUBLIC OUTREACH

Creedmoor recognizes that public participation is an important component in the development of this transition plan. Input from the community has been gathered and used to help define priority areas for improvements within the jurisdiction of Creedmoor.

Public outreach for preparation of this document has consisted of the following activities which can be found in Appendix B:

- ADA Transition Plan Review Checklist
- Announcement of the ADA assessment at a Council Meeting
- Adoption of a Grievance Procedure
- A public survey disseminated through email, newsletters and on City's website

This document was also made available for public comment. Appendix C provides a summary of comments received and detailed information regarding the public outreach activities.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF ADA REQUIREMENTS AND GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES

Under the Americans with Disabilities Act, each agency is required to publish its responsibilities with regard to ADA compliance. A draft of this public notice is provided in Appendix D. If users of Creedmoor's facilities and services believe the city has not provided a reasonable accommodation, they have the right to file a grievance. In accordance with <u>28 CFR Sec. 35.107(b)</u>, the City has developed a grievance procedure for the purpose of the prompt and equitable resolution of citizens' complaints or concerns. This grievance procedure is outlined in Appendix D.

- Prioritize identified issues.
- Inform and educate town officials of findings.
- Develop a budget for addressing issues.
- Coordinate a schedule of needed modifications with proposed remediations.
- Add sign outside Boardroom regarding auxiliary aids available when requested: written, sign language, interpreters, TTY, etc. that are provided by the City.
- City will continue to require ADA training through partnership with the North Carolina League of Municipalities (NCLM).
- Completed implementation activities are in Appendix A & E.



POLICY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Creedmoor prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability with respect to all terms and conditions of employment and access to its activities, programs, and services; and

WHEREAS, any interference, coercion, restraint, retaliation, or reprisal of any person alleging disability discrimination is prohibited; and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of this policy, an individual with a disability is defined as any person who:

- 1. Has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities;
- 2. Has a record of such an impairment; or
- 3. Is regarded as having such impairment.

WHEREAS, the City of Creedmoor is committed to:

- Providing reasonable accommodation for an individual with a disability to participate in employment, activities, programs, and services and has established procedures to allow persons with a disability to request reasonable accommodation;
- 2. Providing access to persons using its facilities, building, and state maintained roads, sidewalks, and crossswalks;
- Ensuring that communications with applicants, participants, beneficiaries, members of the public, and companions with disabilities are as effective as communications with others;
- 4. Auxiliary aids/services are provided upon request to individuals with a disability.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Creedmoor that the City of Creedmoor has an ADA Coordinator who can answer ADA related questions and handle reasonable accommodation requests as well as provide information on established procedures for filing a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of a disability. POLICY STATEMENT

ISSUED PURSUANT TO TITLE II OF THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT AND SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

It is the policy of the City of Creedmoor to ensure that qualified persons with a disability are not denied the benefits of, excluded from participation in, or otherwise subject to discrimination in the application, access to, participation in, or enjoyment of any city facility, service, program, or activity including employment with the City of Creedmoor.

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AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT - GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

This Grievance Procedure has been established to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"). Any individual looking to file a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of disability in the provision of services, activities, programs, or facilities of the City may review the procedure and submit a grievance report form.

The complaint should be in writing and may be submitted using the City's Grievance Form. This form can be found under the ADA Transition Plan tab on the City's website. Alternative means of filing complaints, such as personal interviews or a tape recording of the complaint will be made available for persons with disabilities upon request. All received complaints will be kept confidential.

The complaint should be submitted by the grievant and/or his/her designee as soon as possible but no later than sixty (60) calendar days after the alleged violation took place. Complaints should be submitted to:

Within fifteen (15) calendar days after receipt of the complaint, the ADA Coordinator will contact the grievant to discuss the complaint and the possible resolutions. Within fifteen (15) calendar days of the meeting, the ADA Coordinator will respond in writing, and where appropriate, in a format accessible to the grievant, such as large print, Braille or audio tape. The response will explain the position of the City of Creedmoor regarding the complaint and, when appropriate, offer options for substantive resolution of the complaint.

If the response by the City 's ADA Coordinator does not satisfactorily resolve the issue, the grievant and/or his/her designee may appeal the decision within fifteen (15) calendar days after receipt of the response to the City Manager of the City of Creedmoor.

Within fifteen (15) calendar days after receipt of the appeal, the City Manager will meet with the grievant to discuss the complaint and possible resolutions. Within fifteen (15) calendar days after the meeting, the City Manager will respond with the City's final position on the issue. The response will be in writing and, if necessary, an alternative format that is accessible to the grievant.

All written complaints received by the ADA Coordinator, appeals to the City Manager, and responses from these two officers will be retained by the City of Creedmoor for at least three years.




Q2 Do you participate in programs, services or activities offered by the City of Creedmoor?






Q5 Do you know the person you should contact if you need assistance, have a concern or complaint, or need an accommodation to access a facility, service, or event?


Q6 Have you ever requested an accommodation for a disability from the City?


