“What happens in the ditch doesn’t stay in the ditch...”

The arrival of warm weather brings with it yard cleaning, lawn maintenance, car washing, and home improvement projects. Creedmoor Community Development Office reminds residents to keep storm drains and ditches clear—and the stream they feed clean—with these guidelines:

Chapter 96.09 of the City’s Code of Ordinances states that it shall be unlawful for any person to rake, sweep, blow, wash, direct or place any debris, including but not limited to yard waste, grass clippings, leaves, sediment, trash or debris of any kind into the storm drainage system of the city, including any streets. We encourage residents and landscape professionals to:

- Blow grass clippings back onto the lawn where the nutrients they contain will naturally feed your lawn, reducing the need for chemical fertilizer.
- Wash paint brushes and rollers indoors instead of outdoors where unfiltered runoff may pollute local streams.
- Keep ditches clear of leaves, limbs, debris and runoff from vehicle washing and maintenance.
- Clean up after pets to ensure solid waste does not enter our stormwater system.
- Utilize the city’s Yard Waste Removal service.

The City provides one free pick-up per month for certain yard debris, fill out the request form online or call the city to schedule your pick up. Don’t forget the parkstrip! Chapter 156.25 states that the property owner abutting the parkstrip, the grassy area between the street and the sidewalk, is responsible for its maintenance. If not, you could be the subject of a Notice of Violation and possible civil penalty.

Persons needing the services of a **Notary Public** are encouraged to call ahead to ensure a Notary is available at the specified time. If you are unable to call ahead, **Notary Public** services are generally available at City Hall during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. You may also search the NC Secretary of State’s website for a North Carolina Notary.

Granville County Crimestoppers, is a group of volunteers governed by a board of directors, who are dedicated to making our community a safer place to live and work. Crimestoppers established a tip line **(919-693-3100)** to anonymously report crimes. Crimestoppers' TIP LINE does not record calls nor does it have Caller ID. When someone calls with information, they can be completely confident that they will NOT be identified. Rewards of up to \$2,000 may be paid for information leading to the arrest and indictment of criminals.

Granville County Crimestoppers also provide yard signs identifying residence as supporting Granville County Crimestoppers and advertising the tip line number for a donation of five dollars (\$5). If you would like a sign, please contact the Creedmoor Police Department at **919-528-1515**.

How do I obtain a copy of a police report?

You may obtain a copy of a police report at the Creedmoor Police Department desk from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. There is a \$5.00 fee for each report.

How do I report a pothole or request a street repair?

- Issues with city streets, which are maintained by the City's Public Works Department, may be reported by calling (919) 764-1036.
- Issues with state roads (including NC-56, NC-50, US-15 and some secondary streets), which are maintained by NC DOT, may be reported by calling **(919) 693-8164**.

If you are unsure if the street being reported is a city or NC DOT maintained street, please call City Hall.

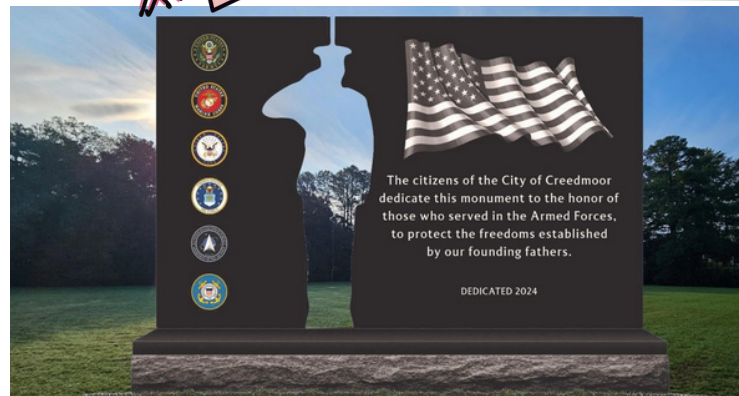

Where can I register to vote?

The Granville County Board of Elections handles voter registration. After completing registration, a voter card is sent via USPS which lists polling places and voting district. Contact the Board of Elections for more information or visit www.granvillecounty.org/government/board-of-elections or call **(919) 693-2515**.



The Creedmoor City Board of Commissioners included in their FY 2023-2024 Budget, \$22,489 for the purchase and installation of a Creedmoor Veterans Memorial to be erected at a prominent location at the New Creedmoor Community Center. The area chosen has been designated as the "Creedmoor Veterans Memorial Plaza" which will also include sidewalks, seating, landscaping, lighting, signage, etc. An ongoing fundraising effort is underway led by the Creedmoor Veterans Organization for the cost of the plaza estimated to be an additional \$66,000 (to date \$4,357 of the \$66,000 has been raised, leaving a need of \$61,643). Anyone interested in participating in our fund raising efforts should contact *Steve Edwards* at sedwards@cityofcreedmoor.org to purchase a Veterans Brick or a Hometown Hero Banner in honor or memory of a veteran. Once the memorial has been installed, a dedication ceremony will be planned for the public to attend.
